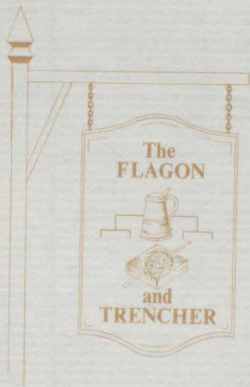

On the other hand, I shall welcome ordinary keepers, as they served both food and drink. [If you have proof that Bangs sold meals, I shall, of course, gladly accept him.

Supplementals are also five dollars each.

I shall retain the documentation you sent, as some of it doubtless will apply to your ordinarykeepers' descendants.

I enclose two application forms for the purpose.

Your check is also enclosed, as the society, not being incorporated, has no bank account. The check should be made out to my name, Special Account. Thus far I have been able to keep the norganization running on the five dollar fees without dues, and I intend to keep it that way.
