

On Friday, May 26,1978 the Texas Chapter of the National Society of Old Plymouth Colony Descendants met at 12:30 at The Texas. The Chapter President, Mr. Herschel W. Anderson, called the meeting to order.

The invocation was given by Mrs, Harry Joseph Morris. Thirteen members and three guests were present. Mr. Anderson reminded the members there were no dues to be paid-merely initiation

fees- -\$ 25.00 for national and \$ 5,00 for state.

Mrs. Joyce Miller in the absence (due to illness) of the Recording Secretary, Mr. Joseph B. Latimer, read the minutes of

the Feb. 14, 1975 meeting. They were approved.

Mrs.C.V.A.Pittman ,Treasurer, reported the balance in the bank as of May 2,1978 was \$ 216.26.Reservations had been made for 25 but since that number had not been reached, a fee of 50¢ per person whoodid not appear was charged by Heritage House. Dear Mr. Bockstruck:

Congratulations are in order. I understand you have been elected President of the Texas N.S.O.P.C.D.

As per your letter: Insignia pins are now \$15 as the new lot just received cost nearly two dollars more each and cannot be sold under cost. In regard to the ribbon and pin, we have some of the members who use a light blue and gold stripe ribbon and with the clasp-type of pin. We do not have the ribbon as a standard item but it sounds like a practicable idea. We do have the push-type pins of the tie-tack type. The ribbons seem to have just popped up with this and that society. The size of our pins are about 11/16ths of an inch.
