


Dear Mr. Freear:

In reply to your letter of August 11th, I agree that there is very definitely a possibility of error in the case of Mr. Bockstruck's Supplemental from George Hasting(s). Under these circumstances it should be cancelled. The filing fee cannot be refunded, but if Mr. Bockstruck wishes to file an alternate Supplemental he may do so without any charge.

As to the acceptability of Thomas Lockett, I do not feel that he is qualifying under Article II of the Constitution of the Society. Equiping someone, and not necessarily one's self, is not the same as actual service.

Thank you for your interesting letter of March 13th.

As to the Edmondson case, I feel that authority additional to the family genealogy is desirable. An examination of the court order books of Augusta County should be made. The son's statement regarding his father's Colonial service is in the nature of family tradition which, by itself, is not considered acceptable proof.

No one has submitted a line from the four ancestors you named as possible Supplementals. In the case of Benjamin Cobb, his name does not appear in MASSACHUSETTS OFFICERS IN THE FRENCH AND INDIAN WARS 1748-1763 recently published by the Society of Colonial Wars in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the Office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Archives Division, and the New England Historic Genealogical Society. The mere use of a military title in a list of town officials is not sufficient proof of service.

Further proof of service would be needed for both Stephen Merrick and Joseph Poole. The Weymouth records should show the latter.

In the work above mentioned, MASSACHUSETTS OFFICERS, etc., a Captain Daniel Read is shown to have served under Colonel Thomas Clapp in a roll dated 1762. Daniel Reed, of Abington was Lieutenant under Captain Jonathan Shores from February 14 to August 14, and Captain from August 15 to December 30 in rolls endorsed in 1760. On the basis of these records I believe your Daniel Reed is a qualifying ancestor.

Dear Mr. Bockstruck:

Many thanks for your letter of July 24th with enclosures. My humblest apologies are owed you since it was my oversight which resulted in the omission of your first nineteen Supplemental lines from the Second Supplement and the 1977 Update. They had been placed with a large bundle of Supplemental lines from other members to await binding, and somehow when the time came to list them for publication they were overlooked. The 1978 Update is already in the works, but I will make sure that they are included in that for 1979. Please forgive my carelessness.

I, too, am slowly filing Supplementals, but my work for this Society and for others leaves me little time for personal genealogical work. I have already registered seventy-two ancestors on my father's side, however, and have about thirty more of his to put on file. Then I will start on my mother's lines, and she had an equal number, if not more. She was the one who got me started in genealogy.

Your project with the Virginia Court Orders sounds most interesting and useful. I am sure you must have discussed it with the Deputy Registrar General, John Frederick Dorman. I am referring your query concerning the eligibility of the ancestors listed in Vol. XXIV of the WILLIAM AND MARY COLLEGE QUARTERLY to him, as he is much more familiar with Virginia genealogical matters than am I. If the list were for one of the New England Colonies, I would say that the men listed were not necessarily qualifying, since here every able bodied male was required to serve in the train band, though many of them never saw any military action.

Your own Supplementals are presently at the bindery, so I, am unable to check them against the list.

My own impression of the list is of an order given to certain individuals, rather than a record of their performance. I would therefore expect some additional evidence that the service ordered was actually performed. As I stated above, however, I defer to Fred Dorman's opinion in this matter, and will send him copies of your letter and the lists, asking him to communicate with you directly.

He is currently a librarian in the genealogical section of the Dallas Public Library, and also teaches genealogy courses at Southern Methodist University, in addition to giving talks to various genealogical groups throughout the southwest.

I believe he will be an excellent member of the Society, and will definitely be a good asset to our membership.

I pray that the committee will look on his proposal for membership favorably.
