He serves the genealogical community as the Immediate Past President of the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS), as well as coordinator for courses at the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy and the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh.

Passionate about family history, Joshua is the author of numerous articles in *American Ancestors*, *Association of Professional Genealogists Quarterly*, *New England Ancestors*, and other publications. He is the recipient of numerous awards, including RootsTech's Distinguished Presenter Award and the FGS Award of Merit.

Joshua holds an MLS (Archival Management) and an MA (History) from Simmons College and has been a featured genealogist on *Who Do You Think You Are?*. At the present time Joshua can be seen taking America through their past as a host on the popular PBS series *Genealogy Roadshow*.
