Blaine has been an instructor for genetic genealogy courses at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research (IGHR), Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy (SLIG), Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh (GRIP), and Virtual Institute of Genealogical Research. Blaine is a graduate of ProGen Study Group 21 and a trustee for the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society. He has been a member of the DNAngels Board of Directors since 2022, serving as President since January 2023. He is a member of the Scientific Working Group on DNA Analysis Methods (SWGDAM) "Investigative Genetic Genealogy Working Group" since 2019.
