Fintan has managed the production of over 150 Irish history and genealogy titles, including the perennial favorite, Researching Scots-Irish Ancestors. Fintan has ensured the Foundation has been at the forefront of developments in Irish genealogy, including the provision of online resources. He helped to pioneer www.rootsireland.ie. the unique database with over 22 million Irish historical records. He is one of the directors of Irish Family History Foundation and board member of the National Collection of Northern Ireland Publications.



Gillian Hunt is a Research Officer with the Ulster Historical Foundation and is responsible for the management of the Foundation's many genealogical activities. She also carries out research for clients.

Gillian is a hugely experienced user of the General Register Office and the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland, and gives talks on family history research internationally. Gillian has been with the Ulster Historical Foundation since 2001, and she has been co-presenting UHF annual North American lecture tours since 2013.
