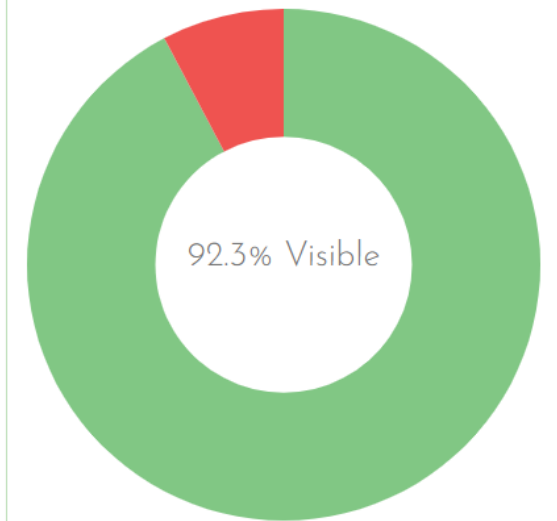

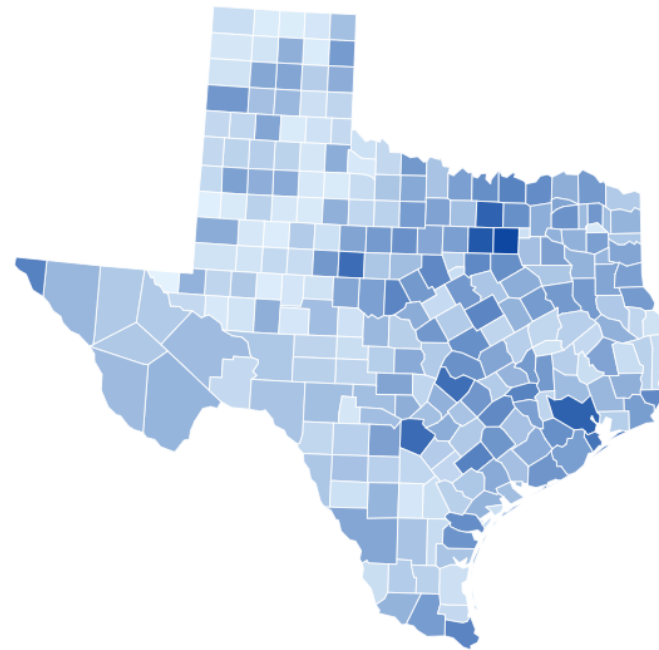

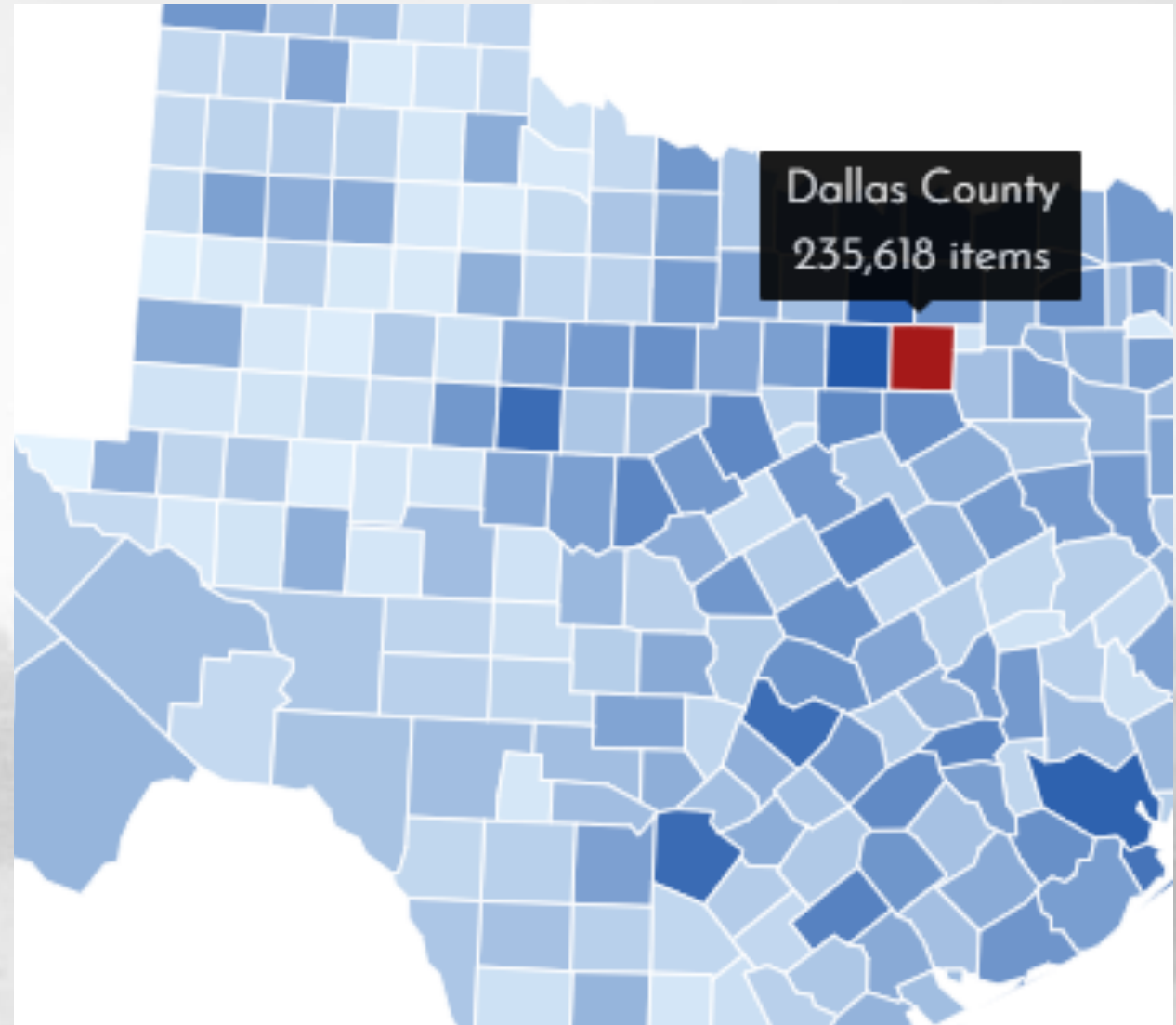

A fire at Temple destroyed the opera and market houses. Loss, about \$30,000; insurance \$10,000.
The Texas State Single Tax League will hold its annual conference in Galveston, Aug. 24, 25 and 26.
The Houston artillery is assisting the sheriff to guard Payton Burton at Houston, the murderer of the Meyers family at Cypress.
Waco's new postmaster has heretofore been a common dairyman. He now has a bigger and richer test to pull.
Payton Burton, the negro who is charged with the murder of the Meyer family at Cypress a few weeks ago, has been captured and lodged in jail at Houston.
Andrew Carnegie, the iron magnate of Pennsylvania, has sent his check for \$5000 to the mayor of Pittsburg, Texas, to establish a public library in that city.
William Williams has instituted suit in the Travis county district court against the International and Great Northern railroad company for \$5000, for having three tons cut off by a train of that road.
The dead body of Mrs. Mary Houser, whose recent disappearance caused great excitement at Van Alstyne, has been found hanging to a fence post in a secluded spot, where the stretch attracted the searchers. Her apron had been twisted about her neck and tied to the post not over four feet from the ground. No marks of violence.

village incorporated for school purposes and those in the country schools are entitled to as good teachers as those in the cities, and trustees should not be debarred from employing them until the best teachers have been employed.
The decision is looked upon as most important and those here who know are of the opinion that this case will be appealed from the superintendent to the state board of education and in the event that tribunal sustains the superintendent in his opinion the matter will be finally settled in the courts.
The superintendent orders that Mrs. Woods be restored to her full privileges as a teacher in the public schools in the independent school district of Pearsall.
In a lengthy decision this ruling has been sustained by the state board of education.

Cotton Crop Report.
Washington, Aug. 11.—The cotton crop report of the department of agriculture says:
Taking the entire cotton producing region as a unit, the condition of the crop of Aug. 1 was exactly the same as on July 1, namely, 91.2. This 4.3 points higher than on Aug. 1, 1897; 11.1 points higher than on Aug. 1, 1898, and 5.8 points higher than the August average for the last ten years.

YELLOW FEVER APPEARS.
One Death Reported at Franklin and Strict Quarantine at Once.
New Orleans, La., Aug. 12.—Yellow fever has developed at Franklin, La., a small town on the line of the Southern Pacific railroad 100 miles west of this city.
Last night John Hobson died under peculiar conditions and the parish physician held an autopsy, resulting in the verdict of yellow fever. The man had been treated for meningitis by the local physicians.
Upon learning of the nature of the disease the Southern Pacific trains loaded to the platforms and many of the residents left the town. The body was buried at once and the premises where he was sick were disinfected.
The Louisiana state board of health at once declared quarantine against Franklin and so did all the neighboring towns. The people of the neighborhood placed pickets around Franklin.
Report is Confirmed.
Austin, Tex., Aug. 13.—Dr. Blunt, the new state health officer, got into the harness quick. He has already located an alleged case or death from yellow fever at Franklin, La., a town 100 miles this side of New Orleans on the Texas and New Orleans railroad. In response to a telegram from Beaumont making inquiries Dr. Blunt wired as follows:
"Report of death from fever at Franklin confirmed."
NEW HEALTH OFFICER.
Dr. Blunt of Lockhart Succeeds the Late Dr. Swearingen.
Austin, Aug. 12.—Gov. Culberson has appointed Dr. W. F. Blunt of Lockhart state health officer, vice Dr. R. M. Swearingen, deceased.
Dr. Blunt was connected with the health department of the state from 1875 to 1897, most of the time was a quarantine officer at Galveston, where he gave great satisfaction and which position he voluntarily resigned about two years ago and returned to Lockhart, his old home. He is an in-

MORMONISM IN TEXAS.
The State Division Into Three Colonies, and Many Others.
This account of the Latter Day Saints appears in the Dallas News. According to a statement made in Dallas not long since by an elder of the church there are about 500 converts to the faith of the Latter Day Saints in this state. These converts are divided into six colonies, which are governed by church officers.
One of these colonies is in Dallas county. It is situated on Mountain creek about eight miles west of this city, and boasts of a membership of about twenty-five. It is said that it was established about a year ago, and that its members are prosperous and happy. The children of the colony attend Sunday-school just the same as other children do, and the grown folks go to church and to prayer-meeting. The meeting house, or church, which is at present used by them, possesses an advantage which is not possessed by the most palatial temple of worship in Dallas—it is cool and pleasant. Under the shade of tall, spreading trees, in a quiet little corner, an enormous arbor has been erected, covered with vines and the home of song birds, it makes an ideal place for worship during the summer months. During week days every member of the colony works from sunrise until sunset. Men, women and children toil the living day. The rule that there must be no safeguards in this human hive is inflexible. It is the policy of this church to send its missionaries into every state in the Union. These missionaries are very zealous. They frequently make a house to house canvass of large cities for recruits. Every nook and cranny is visited. When a sufficient number of converts has been secured, they are formed into a colony and an officer of the church is placed in charge. This officer is quite an important personage, for the government of a Mormon colony by the church is

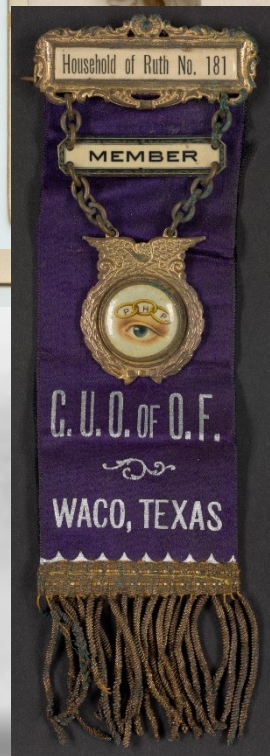
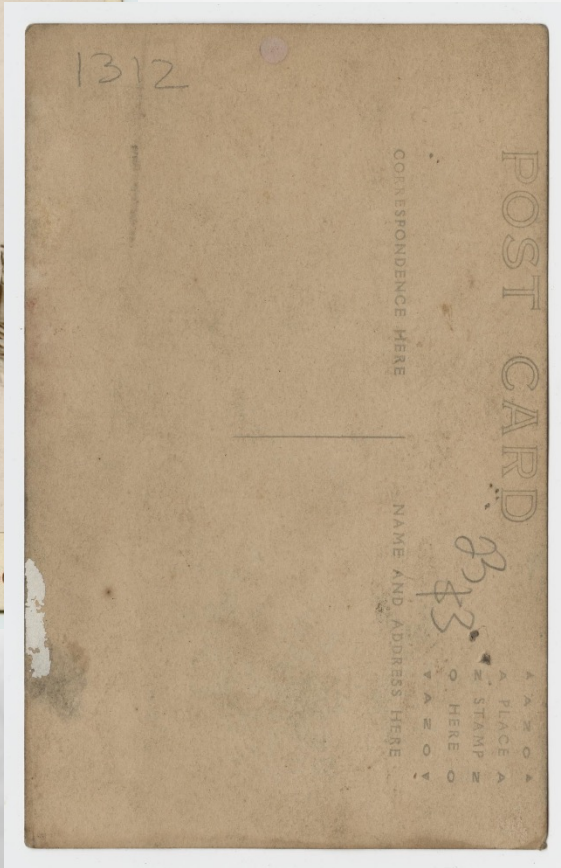

An Act to incorporate the city of Dallas, in Dallas County, Texas.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas, That all the inhabitants of the city of Dallas shall be a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of the "City of Dallas," and as such, by that name, they and their successors shall be known in law, and be capable of contracting and being contracted with, of suing and being sued, and defending in all courts, and all actions, and matters whatsoever, every person and whole and some personal property, and dispose of the same for the benefit of the said city, and every house and acre in corporate debt, and other and change the name of the same.

Section 2. That the form and name of the said corporation shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the east corner of the Trinity River, at low water mark, directly opposite to the corner of the West Texas Express, running thence east parallel with Trinity Street, one and one-half miles, thence north parallel with Jeff Davis Street, three-fourths of one mile, thence west parallel with Trinity Street to same Trinity river, thence down same river with the meanderings thereof to the point of beginning, thence east along the low first described, one and one-half miles, thence north parallel with Jeff Davis Street, three-fourths of one mile, thence west parallel with Trinity Street, one and one-half miles, to same Trinity river, thence south the meanderings thereof to the point of beginning, provided that the same limits of said corporation may be further extended by adding additional territory to the same whenever the majority of the inhabitants of said territory shall so require.

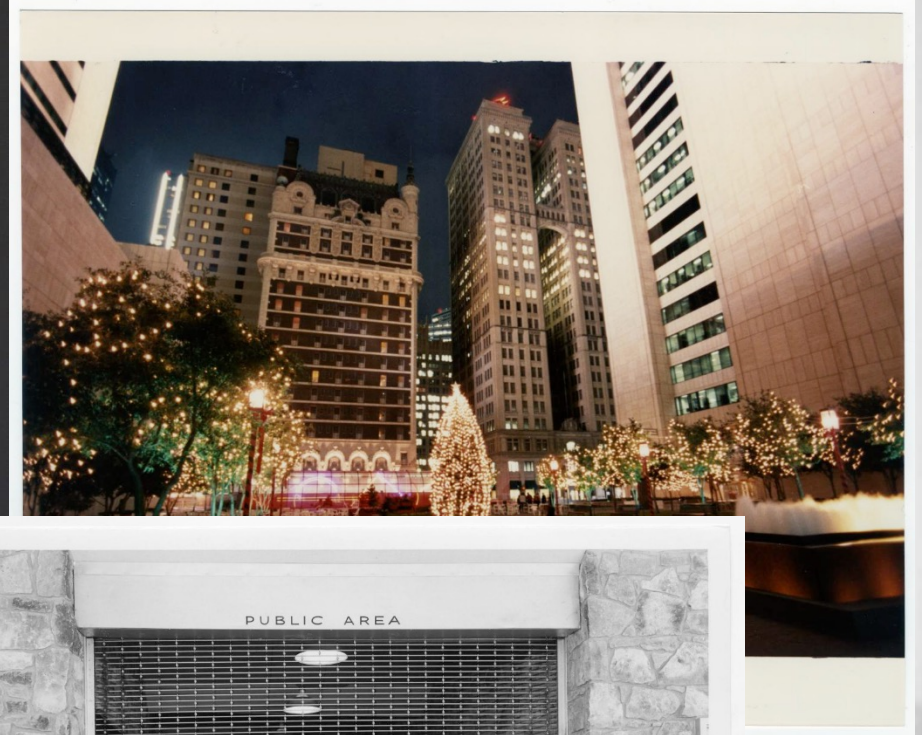

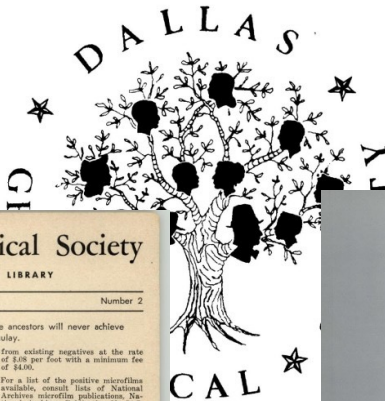

STATE CENSUS

The Bureau of the Census has published a document containing a bibliography of all census records taken by States after the year 1790.

The publication lists in alphabetical order a description of the information contained in each census and the name and address of the person to write, if information is desired from such census. It further advises whether or not any fee is charged and the amount thereof.

For instance, anyone desiring a name search in the 1810 or 1820 Census of the State of Illinois may write to the Trustees of the Illinois State Historical Library and obtain a reply without charge.

A copy of the publication by the Bureau of Census is in the possession of the Society. Copies may be obtained by writing the Superintendent of Documents, United States Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., for the charge of \$20. The publication has no number. The description given above will be sufficient for identification.

FIRST METHODIST CHURCH CEDAR HILL, TEXAS

All of the existing records of the First Methodist Church, Cedar Hill, have been obtained by the Society and are now in the possession of the President.

The Church is one of the oldest in Dallas County, having been established before 1870. The first entry in the existing records is in 1874.

PRIVATE LUDIE W. JACKSON, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. H. Jackson, of Maypearl, was born in Ellis County, July 11, 1895. He finished his education at Fort Worth, Texas. The date of his entry into the service of his country was February 25, 1918. Private Jackson was attached to Company C, 357th Infantry, 90th Division. This Division received its training at Camp Travis, San Antonio, Texas. He was sent to France with his Division, June 20, 1918, and saw action in the battle of St. Mihiel, the first offensive conducted by all-American troops under American leadership, in which a salient occupied by the Germans for more than three years was taken by the Americans in less than two days in the advance on September 12, 1918. Private Jackson received a wound from a machine gun bullet in the left foot. Because of this wound he participated in no further action while in France. Private Jackson had been discharged from the Army, at the time of the collection of this data (August, 1919) and returned to civil life.



PRIVATE CHARLES MONROE WITHERSPOON, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Witherspoon, of Midlothian, was born in Ellis County, August 26, 1897, and received his education in the public schools of Midlothian. He entered the service of his country July 22, 1918, and was attached to 34th Company, 165th Depot Brigade, which trained at Camp Travis. On September 25, 1918, Private Witherspoon was sent overseas, and while in France served with his company. After the armistice was signed, he was ordered to the United States and his discharge followed, after which he returned to civil life.



CLIFFORD SMITH WITHERSPOON, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. B. Witherspoon, of Midlothian, Texas, was born January 7, 1900, at Midlothian and it was here that he received his early education. Although only eighteen years of age, Mr. Witherspoon volunteered for service in the United States Navy, August 7, 1918, and was sent for training to the Naval Training Station at San Pedro, California. Signing of the armistice prevented his assignment to active duty on the high seas during the Great War, as his course of training had not yet been completed at that time. After receiving his discharge, he returned to civil life.
