This Indenture Made the Twenty seventh Day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one Between Jacob Chinberger and Eve his Wife of Landowary Township in the County of Bedford and State of Pennsylvania of the one part and Valentine Horn of the Township of County and State of the other part Witnesses that Whereas the aforesaid Jacob Chinberger obtained a Patent from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a certain Tract of one hundred and sixteen Acres of Land called Gun-Stock Situate on Eglar's Run in the Township of Landowary County of Bedford and State of Pennsylvania BEGINNING At an Ironwood and running thence South sixty seven perches to a White oak; and South thirty nine Degrees East eighty four perches and two tenths to a post thence by Crogs land and Vacant land North forty two Degrees East one hundred and forty three Perches to a White oak thence by Vacant hills North twenty five Degrees West one hundred and twenty seven Perches and on that to a post from thence to the place of BEGINNING (a straight line) Containing sixty Acres and the allowance of six ff. This Indenture Made the Twelfth Day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one Between Henry Gosna and Elizabeth his Wife of Brothers Valley Township Bedford County and State of Pennsylvania of the one part and Jacob Brezard of the same part of the other part; Whereas by a Patent from the Supreme Executive Council of the State of Pennsylvania bearing date the Eight day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six A certain Tract of Land calling Habitation which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Henry Gosna dated the 16th February 1786. And Whereas the said Henry Gosna conveyed the same to Jacob Brezard. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of Two hundred pounds Lawfull Money of Pennsylvania to me the said Henry Gosna in hand well and truly paid by the said Jacob Brezard at or before the sealing or Delivery of these Presents and also the further sum of five shillings the receipt Whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell Release and confirm unto the said Jacob Brezard his heirs and assigns the before said Tract of Land calling Habitation situate on the South side of Buffaloe Sick Creek in Brothers Valley Township Bedford County Beginning at a Corner White oak of the said Henry Gosna's other Land thence by the same North twenty Degrees East one hundred and seventy two perches and eight tenths to a Corner post of Jacob Gosna's first Land thence by the same North sixty nine degrees and a quarter West one hundred and forty seven perches and one half to a Sugar tree and North thirty eight Degrees West one hundred and forty four perches and one half to a White oak in a line of John Burrylawa thence by the same North eighty five degrees West seventy six perches to a post in a line of Jacob Gosna's Land and thence by the same South thirty one Degrees West forty four perches to a post South twenty degrees East sixty perches to an Ironwood Tree South fourteen Degrees West fifty two perches to an Ironwood Tree South Nineteen degrees East fifty seven perches to a White oak South thirty two degrees East eighty five perches to a Maple Tree and North eighty four degrees East sixty perches and six tenths to the place of BEGINNING Containing Two hundred and thirty five acres and one half and allowance of six ff. Cont for and in Consideration of the sum of Five pounds Lawfull Money of Pennsylvania to them in Hand Paid by Valentine Horn the receipt Whereof they do hereby acknowledge hath Granted bargained sold assigned released and confirmed And by these Presents both grant Bargain'd etc. Assign'd Release and Confirm unto the said Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns that the said Jacob Chinberger and Eve his Wife and their heirs the hereby bargained and sold Premises and every Part and parcel thereof to the said Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns their heirs shall and will Remain and for ever Remain by these Presents.
