Seminars



Assist and support the Genealogy & History Division of the J. Erik Jonsson Central Library

The Society has a long-standing history of supporting the Genealogy & History Division of the Dallas Public Library. The total value of the cash, books, microfiche, microfilm, equipment and other donations provided directly or indirectly by the Dallas Genealogical Society to the library is \$789,093.12. Donations made during this period include the following:

- The total value of books donated to the Genealogy & History Division was \$1,595.67.
- The society donated \$3,970.00 to fund a service contract on the i2S CopiBook Scanner located in the 8th floor Heritage Lab).
- The society provided funds to provide library patrons with access to NewspaperArchive.com (\$3578.00) and HistoryGeo.com (\$2600.00).

Bockstruck Scholarships

The society continues to provide scholarships of up to \$1,500 each year to be used by members of the Genealogy & History Division staff to fund attendance and participation at Genealogical Seminars and related events.

Equipment Donation

The society donated two Sennheiser wireless microphones to the library to be used at meetings and events. These devices had been purchased by the society several years ago but are no longer required because the library now provides all equipment required for our meeting and seminars.

Collecting, Preserving and Copying Information

Oakland Cemetery

The Oakland Cemetery Association has donated paper burial records to the Archives section at the Dallas Public Library. DGS members are working with members of the Friends of the Oakland Cemetery group to organize and catalog the documents.

Family Search has digitized records created prior to January 1, 1999. A major focus of this project is to identify records created after that date:

Burial Information will be entered into the Dallas Genealogical Society Cemetery Database.

Relevant documents will be identified and made available to Family Search so they can be microfilmed and added to the existing collection of images. Family Search personnel are aware of this effort.
