### **DNA Workshop**



78 people registered to participate in our June 8 "You Have Your Ancestry.com DNA Results: Now What?" workshop led by Barbara Coakley and Tony Hanson. 33 participated in-person at the library, and the others participated virtually via Zoom. In a first for this type of event we had a remote location: 12 members of the Robson Ranch Genealogy Club participated from a facility at their location.

# Assist and support the Genealogy & History Division of the J. Erik Jonsson Central Library

The Society has a long-standing history of supporting the Genealogy & History Division of the Dallas Public Library. The total value of the cash, books, microfiche, microfilm, equipment and other donations provided directly or indirectly by the Dallas Genealogical Society to the library is \$817,204.10. Donations made during this period include the following:

- The total value of books donated to the Genealogy & History Division was \$1,595.67.
- The society donated \$4,180.00 to fund a service contract on the i2S CopiBook Scanner located in the 8th floor Heritage Lab).
- The society provided funds to provide library patrons with access to NewspaperArchive.com (\$3,945.00) and HistoryGeo.com (\$2,600.00).
- Purchase of 64 books requested by the Genealogy Section Staff \$1,972

### **Bockstruck Scholarships**

The society renewed their commitment to provide scholarships of up to \$1,500 each year to be used by members of the Genealogy & History Division staff to fund attendance and participation at Genealogical Seminars and related events for the next 5 years.

# Collecting, Preserving and Copying Information

### **DGS Publications**

- All DGS Newsletters, Journals and Quarterlies are indexed and linked to digital images on the DGS Website.
- We continue to add records to our online database of Cemetery Records: at present there are 41,748 records available in a database that is available to the public on our website.
- Copies of society documents (paper and BlueRay CD) from the previous year were provided to the Archives (7<sup>th</sup> Floor at the Dallas Public Library) to be placed in the Society archive maintained by the Dallas Public Library.
- We have initiated an effort to add links to FindAGrave.com, BillionGraves.com, digitized death certificate images to each record in the database. At present, 1159 records (2.78%) have been completed.

### Induction of Lloyd DeWitt Bockstruck into the National Genealogical Society Hall of Fame

Long-time DGS member Lloyd DeWitt Bockstruck was selected by the National Genealogical Society to be inducted into the National Genealogy Hall of Fame in 2023. This award honors outstanding genealogists whose achievements in American genealogy have had a great impact on the field and who have been deceased for at least five years. Their contributions to genealogy in this country need to be significant in a way that was unique, pioneering, or exemplary. Entries are judged by a panel of genealogists from various parts of the United States.

### North Texas Giving Day

The society participated in the 2022 Campaign and raised a total of \$3,387.89 which was used to offset the cost of providing access to HistoryGEO.com and NewspaperArchive.com.

# Tarrant County Black Historical & Genealogical Society Donation

When the Lone Star virtual chapter of the Association of Professional Genealogists was dissolved in 2022, they donated \$500 to the Dallas Genealogical Society with the stipulation that the funds were to be used for digitization projects.

The Board of Directors decided to donate the funds to the Tarrant County Black Historical & Genealogical Society in support of their digitization project. DGS President Tony Hanson presented the check to Brenda Sanders-Wise (TCBHGS Executive Director) on October 24, 2023.

### Thanksgiving Square Biographies

DGS members Regena Street, Kathleen Murray, Barbara Ware, and Michelle Dwyer Cohen researched the historical and genealogical backgrounds of the four Foundation Directors of Thanksgiving Square and presented the information to Kyle Ogden, President and CEO.

# Community Interest Survey

# Financial Information

### Investment Committee

The Investment Committee recommended that the society divest itself of bond investments and move the funds into CDs instead. A \$100,000 fund was approved for this purpose by the board and four \$25,000 CDs were purchased in December.

### Financial Review Committee

The committee report stated:

"The committee concluded that the financial and statutory issues of the society were in good order and highly commended the work that Susan Rainwater has been doing in her position as Treasurer for the organization."

### North Texas Giving Day

The society again participated in the annual North Texas Giving Day event, with the objective of raising \$6500 to provide patrons of the Dallas Public Library with access to NewsPapers.com and HistoryGEO.com. A total of \$3,387.89 was raised: The balance of the required funding was provided from Society funds.
