<u>ICROFILM COLLECTION</u>: A campaign is under way to collect the Revolutionary War Pension Applications on microfilm to donate to the Genealogy Section of the Dallas Public Library. There are 898 rolls in the complete set. On August 1, DPL needed 307 rolls to complete their set. As of this writing, 60 rolls have been donated by DGS Members giving one or two rolls at a time. To avoid a call from our friend, Helen Lu, you may want to call her to pledge a roll, or send a check to her or to our P.O. Box made payable to "Dallas Genealogical Society", with the notation "For Rev. W. P. A. Film". Each roll is \$12, and is tax deductible. The completion goal is our 25th anniversary, November 1, 1979. (Yes!)

<u>NO PURSES</u>: Guess who is wearing a money belt? Purse thieves must know how absorbed genealogists get in their research, because the Genealogy Section of DPL has always been, and is now, an easy target. TX RESEARCHERS: Three bills have just passed that will help preserve important primary genealogical information in Texas: 1. Provides for municipal control of unkept cemeteries. 2. Gives counties authority to own and care for cememteies. (May already be providing maintenance.) 3. Doubles the budget for the TX County Records Inventory Project (the statewide survey of courthouse records).
