Representatives of the British and American governments signed the Treaty of Paris at the Hotel d'York in Paris on 3 September 1783. This document marked the official conclusion of the Revolutionary War between the mother country and her former colonies. Last fall dignitaries from both countries assembled again in Paris to commemorate the 200th Anniversary (Bicentennial) of the signing of the Treaty. DGS member, Patricia Love Stephens, attended the celebration and will give us a firsthand account of the events. Don't miss her slide presentation and lecture based on this historic occasion! PLEASE NOTE: National Archives and Records Service have made important changes in processing requests by researchers for copies of veterans' records and passenger arrival records, pensions, bounty lands or compiled military service records. On 1 May 1984 NATF Form 80 must be used for copies of military service records, pensions, bounty land records or compiled military service records. NATF Form 81 must be used for all passenger arrival records. One form per request is mandatory. (Prior NATF Forms 26 and 40 will just be returned). Changes in payment policies will take effect on 1 May also. Payment should not be sent with NATF forms 80 and 81. NARS will research the request, bill the researcher and hold the records located and copied for 30 days, within which time payment must be made according to instructions sent with billing. Copies of Forms 80 and 81 may be obtained by writing: Reference Services Branch (NNIR) National Archives and Records Service, 8th and Pennsylvania Av. N.W., Washington, DC 20408.
