The categories are:

- 1) Book with a minimum of 50 pages on family history or genealogy.

- 3) Manuscript with a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on family history or genealogy.
- 4) Manuscript with a minimum of five pages, single spaced, on local historical or genealogical interest.
