The Dallas Genealogical Society was founded in 1955 with the following objectives:

- TO CREATE, FOSTER AND MAINTAIN INTEREST IN GENEALOGY AND FAMILY HISTORY.
- TO RAISE STANDARDS OF GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH THROUGH EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS, WORKSHOPS AND THE PUBLICATION OF DATA.

- TO COPY, INDEX AND PUBLISH RECORDS, DOCUMENTS, INSCRIPTIONS AND OTHER GENEALOGICAL SOURCE MATERIALS.
- TO SUPPORT THE GENEALOGY SECTION OF THE DALLAS PUBLIC LIBRARY.
- TO STIMULATE THE EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION BETWEEN SOCIETY MEMBERS AND GENEALOGICAL RESEARCHERS ACROSS THE NATION.

MEMBERSHIP: The Dallas Genealogical Society is a non-profit, federally tax-exempt organization. Individuals, libraries or societies may apply for membership. Annual dues are \$12.00 for the calendar year if paid by January 31, after January 31 they are \$14.00. [Note: Dues for 1993 will be \$15.00 before January 31 and \$18.00 after.] All current members receive the quarterly journal and the newsletter.

QUARTERLY: The Dallas Quarterly publishes source material and articles of general interest concerning Dallas County and Texas. Manuscripts together with a cover letter giving the Society permission to publish the material should be submitted to the Editor at the DGS mailing address. 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PRESIDENTS REPORT 1991-1992

Reflection. An image, as in a mirror. Meditation. Comment.

The President's Year End Report provides an opportunity for all of these.

Looking back to a year ago, I reflect on the momentum with which the 1991-1992 Board of Directors began their work. Even before the first regular meeting of the society, the Board held a reception for Dr. Ralph Crandall of the New England Historic Genealogical Society. Then, in their enthusiasm, they planned another reception prior to the September meeting to allow the Society members to meet Dr. Crandall in person.

This "Let's Do It" spirit set the tone for this years board.

Linda Rogers was the driving force behind our 4th Annual Fall Genealogy Symposium and Annual Beginners Workshop. Twenty four basic, intermediate and advanced sessions were planned and organized. In addition, an all day beginners workshop and 8 computer sessions were held. Total registration for the day was 544 and that didn't count speakers, board members and exhibitors.

At the November regular meeting the Society held a reception honoring Heather Williams, Manager of the History and Social Sciences Division of the Dallas Public Library.

December brought us to the time DGS could finally place an order with the American Genealogical Lending Library for 1,529 rolls of microfilm of the 1920 census. This project was begun in the spring of 1991 by Pat Hatcher, during her term as president. Pat's work coordinating the drive and contributions of the Society members and friends made possible the purchase of this important source of research material.

The Dallas Genealogical Society does not rest long on its laurels. Even as we were enjoying the accomplishment of a successful fall symposium and the excitement of our first order for the 1920 census, Bruce Moseley as chair of the spring seminar was already hard at work.

Martha Hoffman Rising was the distinguished speaker of the 36th annual DGS Spring Seminar held at the Richardson Civic Center on Saturday, 28 March 1992. The seminar proved to be another DGS mega hit. The final count was 682 paid attendees and 20 hardworking board members plus 53½ vendor tables rented. What a day!

It is an object of the Society to publish records preserving the history of Dallas and Dallas county. This year's board worked diligently to fulfill this charge. Many hours were dedicated to recording inventories of cemeteries and to copying marriage records at the Dallas County courthouse. The cemetery centurions braved rain, mud, heat and sun to climb fences and fight off poison ivy in order to record the information that is being lost or

destroyed in the county's cemeteries. Another small army hefted dusty old record books and copied records, while the third battalion attacked the data entry work on their trusty computers. Future genealogists researching Dallas County will thank each and every one of these dedicated people. As I do.

In May an audit committee consisting of Sam Holmes, Sam Akins and Dwayne Rimmer was appointed to audit the Society's books.

This year a By-law Review Committee was established, consisting of the following DGS members; Madilyn Crane, chair, Jeanne Tabb, Margaret Ann Thetford and Margret Pearce, ex officio.

The society is healthy. The membership as of May 1992 was 893 total DGS memberships reflecting 183 new members. Our treasury reflects our sound financial health showing a total of all funds at \$31,006.76.

At the Annual Business Meeting in May a total gift of \$15,000.00 was presented to the Genealogy Section of the Dallas Public Library. Fourteen thousand dollars of this amount was given in honor of Margaret Ann Thetford for her many years of service to the genealogical community and especially to DGS. The remaining \$1000 was given in memory of deceased members of the Dallas Genealogical Society.

This year, to add additional interest and opportunity for the study of genealogy, the board voted to sponsor a three part summer lecture in cooperation with the Dallas Public Library and named Sammie Lee to guide the project. As a result, on July 25 the board was able to present Lloyd Bockstruck with a check in the amount of \$8,360.34 for the purchase of equipment and materials for the genealogy section of the Dallas Public Library.

I am reminded of my September 1991 president's letter when I reported reading of the 1971 DGS minutes. Closing balance - \$1,402. Membership - 254.

Looking to the future - The 1991-1992 Board established the Dallas Genealogical Society Endowment Fund and set aside \$2000 as seed money.

Dedication and hard work is the hallmark of every member of the board of directors of the Dallas Genealogical Society. I am privileged to have been numbered in that company.

One of the greatest honors of my life is to have served as president for the Society and I thank you for the opportunity.

★ REPUBLIC OF TEXAS RESIDENCY ★ PROVED BY OBITUARIES

INTRODUCTION

It is often difficult to prove that an individual was in Texas during the Republic of Texas period; that is, before February 19, 1846 when the Annexation Agreement of the Republic of Texas with the United States of America was consummated. Although many Republic of Texas inhabitants are found in these newspapers, only persons whose Republic era residency is actually proved or strongly implied by this source have been selected.

Since only minimum information is given in this listing, it is recommended that the researcher consult the original newspaper source (or abstract) for a more detailed record. Abstracts of these newspapers are available for purchase from Dallas Genealogical Society on microfiche. See listing of denominational newspapers on page 164 and DGS publications on inside back cover of this quarterly for more information. Microfilm of these newspapers and copies of the abstracts are in the Dallas Public Library, J.Erik Jonsson Central Library, Genealogy Section.

Names are arranged alphabetically and within the entries are included some individuals who, although mentioned, were **NOT** stated to be in Texas prior to statehood. Some listings do not give enough information to determine if the individual was in Texas during the Republic period, that is, before 19 February 1846. In these cases where it is unclear the following note has been added: (month/year not given, before statehood ?)

SURNAME SEARCHES

by Arlene H. Eakle, PhD.

The major purpose of secondary records, both printed and manuscript sources, is to share what other genealogists have compiled on your ancestors providing you with:

1. clues to keep you searching when others give up;
2. from 10 to 300 years of traced and often documented genealogy;
3. and complete lineage and family charts.

Especially valuable will be the family data included in these records, data in the possession of family members unknown to you. As families are split by separation and migration over time, there is no way to determine who gets the family heirlooms, which family members corresponded with each other over a span of years, or where the family bible finally came to rest—until you find these materials reproduced in facsimile in a family history or quoted in a county biography.

For families who immigrated since 1900, county histories will be less useful, for the majority of these date from the years following the Civil War and were usually in print well before 1920. For recent immigrants, however, periodical literature can provide many of the same details including local U.S. addresses and specific towns or villages of birth overseas.

SEARCH STRATEGIES

Surname Target Approach. Begin with the surnames appearing on your lineage chart. If you have an uncommon surname, use the surname approach at or near the beginning of your research work. If you have a common name, your results will be better and more productive if you know something about your family before you start checking library catalogs. You need certain basic details before you can recognize your own Smith family from the many Smith entries you will find.

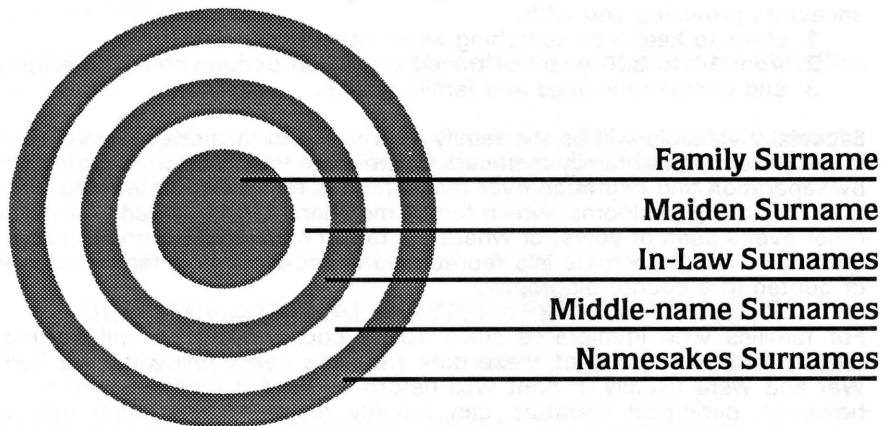

Draw an archery target with at least five rings. Align the names from your lineage and family charts to coincide with the rings in this order:

Systematically search each surname connected with your ancestor in library catalogs: family surname, maiden surname of wife or mother, in-law surnames of brothers-in-law, uncles, or nephews, middle names of children like Ambrose Smallwood Curtis, and namesakes within the family like Swinfield Hill which appear in each family unit in each generation.

Daniel Masterson McCormack, a resident of Saline County, Missouri, married Miss Harriet Hanny (Haynie) of Howard County according to a biographical statement in the *History of Saline County*. Harriet's death certificate listed her father as Alexander Haynie born Virginia and her mother as Judith Haynie also born Virginia. Further research documented a marriage between an Alexander Haynie and a Judith Haynie in Northumberland County, Virginia but identifying Judith's parents seemed more difficult. Using the surname target for research in county histories, however, a biographical sketch for Edwin Moore Haynie in Saline County, Missouri yielded some helpful clues:

EDWIN MOORE HAYNIE

Edwin M. Haynie, an ex-soldier and highly esteemed citizen, now living in honorable retirement after a long and useful life devoted to the pursuit of agriculture, is a native of Saline county and a son of Edwin and Polly (Moore) Haynie, both born in Virginia. Lawrence Haynie, the subject's grandfather, was a prominent planter and slaveholder of Northumberland county, that state, and a man of great influence in the community in which he lived. He died there many years ago and left a family of five sons and two daughters,

whose names are as follows: Austin, Max, Lawrence, Jr., Edwin, Walter, Lydia and Juda. The four older migrated in an early day to Missouri, and settled in Saline county. Austin served in the war of 1812, and died in his native state; Lydia remained near the place of her birth, and Juda, after marrying a Mr. Frisby, came to Saline county, Missouri, and later moved to Howard county, where she spent the remainder of her life.

Edwin Haynie married in Virginia, Polly Moore, and in 1836 moved to Missouri and located in Miami township, Saline county, where he purchased a farm and engaged in agricultural pursuits. Later he entered land and in due time became a large farmer and slave holder and one of the leading citizens of his community. During the late war he sympathized with the South and had three sons in the Confederate service, on account of which he was subjected to not a few indignities and dangers, which caused him to leave his farm and take up residence in the town of Miami, where he remained until the war closed and conditions resumed their normal aspect. He then returned to the farm, where he spent the rest of his days. A man of strict integrity and sterling worth, he did much to promote the material interests of the country, stood for law, order and good citizenship, and will long be remembered by the people among whom he spent so many years.

Judith (called Juda in the biography) was the daughter of Lawrence Haynie who died in Northumberland County, Virginia. She remarried after Alexander Haynie died and lived in Howard County where Daniel McCormack found Harriet. These clues supplied in a biography for a nephew provided the necessary information for research to be completed in Howard County, Missouri and in Northumberland County, Virginia.

There is no one source to which you can go for names and addresses of genealogists researching family lines in common with yours. The process of locating this work may be almost as involved as the beginning stages of research itself. In the long haul however, you can save uncounted hours and expense if you take the time to determine what has already been written. Specific help can be found in the following books: Marion J. Kaminkow has compiled a series of volumes listing Genealogies in the Library of Congress: A Bibliography, 2 vols. (Baltimore: Magna Carta Book Company, 1972); with Supplement, 1972-1976 (Baltimore: Magna Carta Book Company, 1977); and Supplement, 1976-1986 (Baltimore: Magna Carta Book Company, 1987); Complement to Genealogies in the Library of Congress: A Bibliography of Twenty Thousand Additions from Forty-five Libraries (Baltimore: Magna Carta Book Company, 1981); and United States Local Histories in the Library of Congress: A Bibliography, 5 vols. (Baltimore: Magna Carta Book Company, 1972-1976).

These volumes provide titles and locations for more than 45,000 family histories and almost an equal number of county and local histories. Unfortunately, the volumes above do not include the holdings of two significant libraries — the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston and the LDS Family History Library in Salt Lake City. Both libraries have extensive holdings, including one-of-a-kind printed volumes and manuscript histories.

The Greenlaw Index of the New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2 vols. (Boston: G. K. Hall, 1979) compiled by William Prescott Greenlaw provides access to pre-1979 holdings. For the LDS Family History Library check the Family History Library Catalog (on microfiche) at your nearest Branch Library. This catalog is up-dated, analytical, and fully cross referenced.

Clarence S. Peterson compiled Consolidated Bibliography of County Histories in Fifty States in 1961, 2nd ed. (Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Company, 1963) listing nearly 3,000 histories of at least 100 pages in length. This bibliography has been up-dated and substantially expanded to include some 5,000 titles by P. William Filby. A Bibliography of American County Histories (Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1985) is a valuable addition to our reference aids. It is not annotated — a feature we have come to expect from Mr. Filby — and it does not include many histories published in the past years for local genealogical societies, county history committees, and even some ambitious individuals who chose to publish and distribute their works themselves using local presses to print the volumes. These volumes turn up in libraries all over the country (actually different titles in every library you visit) and you need to watch for them since their publication is not reported in standard finding tools.

Mr. Filby, former Director, Maryland Historical Society and a skilled bibliographer, published the third edition of his American & British Genealogy and Heraldry: A Selected List of Books (Boston: New England Historic Genealogical Society, 1983) with a massive 9,773 titles meticulously indexed by author, title and subject. His annotated entries include family and local histories as well as source extracts and indexes, and reference works.

Nettie Schreiner-Yantis has produced four editions of Genealogical and Local History Books in Print, 6 vols. (Springfield, Va.: Genealogical Books in Print, 1975-85) providing access to more than 50,000 books of interest to genealogists. A current supplement is in preparation. Included are titles published by authors who have written only one book and printed it at their own expense. The only place you will find these titles listed is in Genealogy Books in Print. Books are arranged by subject and locality. there is no general index however, and you may have to check through the whole section to find the title you seek.

Family genealogies and histories (including published family Bibles) are listed in a separate section with a helpful cross index of allied families. Names and addresses of vendors are include for all titles so if you want the book yourself, you know where to order it — more than 3200 in the 4th edition (1985). Titles are not duplicated from one edition to another, so you will want to check all 6 volumes for the surnames and localities you wish to research. The massive 4th edition includes microfilms as well as books and provides access to more than 22,000 surnames.

Also helpful in locating family and local histories, maps, atlases, periodical indexes and other compiled sources are the sales catalogs of genealogical book sellers across the country.

SOME DEATHS REPORTED IN THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS 1889

This is a guide to deaths mentioned in the *Dallas Morning News* in the year 1889. It is important to note that the dates given are **NOT** the DEATH dates, but rather are the dates the articles appeared in the newspaper. There may be more than one listing, either in one issue or several issues. The page and column number are listed to help find the specific article.

While most of the deaths mentioned took place in Dallas or neighboring counties, the geographic scope of the coverage is amazing and many of the listed deaths took place outside Texas.

The *Dallas Morning News*, published in Dallas, Texas, by A. H. Belo Publishers has been in existence since 1885 and is still published daily. It has been microfilmed and is available in the Texas/Dallas Collection of the J. Erik Jonsson Central Library, Dallas Public Library System.

FRIENDS IN HIGH PLACES LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

While researching in Florida, these letters were shown to us as being of historical interest to Texans since two of them were written by Sam Houston and another by Andrew Jackson. Although the historical value is obvious, the letters also have a genealogical interest for descendants of Patton Anderson. From these few letters, the following facts about him can be discovered; his state of birth, his state of residence, his profession, his financial standing, the name of his uncle, and that his father is deceased. Apparently, the letters worked; on page 234, *The Territorial Papers of the United States, Volume XXII, The Territory of Florida 1824-1828* compiled by Clarence Edwin Carter, is an "Abstract of Payments by Robert Butler for Surveying Public Lands" showing that on December 20, 1824, Patton Anderson was paid \$235.28 for surveying 52.82 miles.

Bellview, 18th July 1824

Dear Sir,

Mr. Patton Anderson, a nephew of Col. William P. Anderson, is desirous to obtain the appointment of deputy surveyor under you.

He is a young man, with whom I have been acquainted for several years, but not intimately. I have no personal knowledge of his qualifications as a surveyor, he tells me that one Mr. James Bright has given him a certificate. I know him well, he is an honest man & an excellent surveyor. My information regarding Mr. Anderson is that he is a smart clever young man and applies himself to business.

He is fatherless, has no means of support, but his own exertions and is pennyless. — From your known philanthropy and benevolence, I feel a confidence you will do justice among the numerous applications which have and will be made to you and if any favor be shown it will be to the worthy and necessitous.

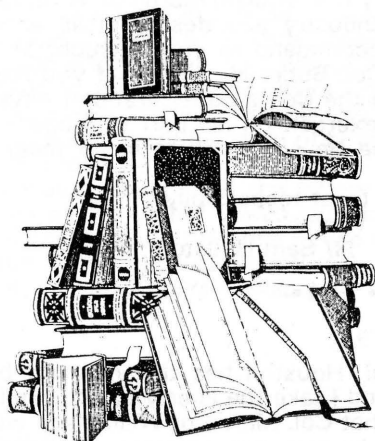

BOOK REVIEWS

GENEALOGICAL ABSTRACTS FROM GREENVILLE COUNTY, S.C.: THE EARLIEST MINUTE BOOKS OF TEN BAPTIST CHURCHES, 1794-1850. Bill Storey and Anne K. McCuen. 1992. Hardback, 6" x 9", vii + 375 pages. Indexed. \$26.00 plus \$2.00 P&H. Order from Alston & McBee Publishers, 245 Congaree Road #316, Greenville, SC 29607.

The ten churches covered in this book are widely dispersed throughout the county. They are (original name in parentheses): Brushy Creek, Clear Spring, Fork Shoals, Gowensville (Cross Roads), Milford, Mountain Creek, Reedy River (Head of Enoree), Standing Springs, Tyger (Concord), and Washington.

~~Baptist minute books were kept by church clerks to record the detailed business of the congregation. They are loaded with the names of individuals and information about their lives--when and by what method they joined the church; where they came from before joining or where they transferred to; and birth, death and marriage data that may not appear anywhere else.~~

The authors rely heavily on cryptic abbreviations in making their abstracts, so one reads this book with a finger inserted where the master list appears. Admirably they have created a composite membership list for each of the ten churches. Their index has almost 18,000 entries covering about 5,500 personal names, and they have amassed a valuable collection of heretofore scarce material.

JOSIAH CARTER (1745 - 1822) HIS FORBEARS, DESCENDANTS AND ALLIED FAMILIES. Randolph A. Malone. 1989. Hardback, 8.5" x 11", 462 pages. Name indexed. \$33.00, including P&H. Order from the author, 143 Tuxedo Drive, Thomasville, Ga. 31792.

Josiah CARTER was born in Virginia but moved to Georgia during the Revolutionary period. He and his wife, Mary ANTHONY, had twelve children. Part I of this book covers Josiah's forebears, his own life, and his descendants. In Part II, brief histories of twenty-five allied families are provided. Approximately 1,000 CARTER names appear in the index, along with over 10,000 others. Those mentioned most frequently are ASBURY, BATTLE, BOND, DUNSON, HARRIS, KINGMAN, MADDIX and SMITH.

Mr. Malone is double dipped in CARTERS. His mother carried the surname, but his father was also descended from Josiah and the two parents were fifth cousins. Malone has put together an extensive collection of vital statistics in an orderly way. As a result the book is reasonably easy to use.



JOHANNES C. AND SOPHIA "HOLDEN" HOOVEL - A LINE OF DESCENT. Edward Baker Faust. 1985. Paperback, spiral bound, 8.5" x 11", 180 pages. Name indexed. \$25.00, including P&H. Order from the author, 2327 N.W. Cascade, East Wenatchee, Wash. 98801.

Seven generations are covered in this story which begins with Christopher TOLLEFSRUDE, who was born in Norway in 1781. His children came to America in the mid-1800's and followed a typical Scandinavian migration pattern through Wisconsin and Minnesota to Washington and Oregon. Over 250 names are indexed.

Picking one's way through a family history is often a challenging process. In the HOOVEL case, the challenge is mounted by siblings who choose their own surnames. For example, Johannes has brothers and sisters named HOVEL, HOOVEL, HAVELSON and TOLLEFSRUDE. A few simple charts and a rudimentary numbering system provide some help in keeping the confusion to a minimum, and it's actually possible to follow the complete Line of Descent which the title promises.

SAMUEL BELL'S RIDDLE (BELLS IN TENNESSEE 1756-1982). Eldon Raymond Bell. 1982. 115 pages on 2 fiche. Indexed. \$3.00 postpaid. Order from Ancestor Publishers at the above address.

According to the author, the riddle is "Where did Samuel Bell come from and who were his parents?" The book doesn't give a definite answer, but it does provide information on about 400 BELL descendants and a like number of related surnames. Those which appear most often are CAMPBELL, GIBBS, HENDERSON, HENRY, JOHNSON, MURRAY and REYNOLDS.

~~CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE HISTORY OF ANCIENT FAMILIES OF NEW AMSTERDAM AND NEW YORK - 1633-1881.~~ Edwin R. Purple. 1881. 126 pages on 1 fiche. Indexed. \$3.00 postpaid. Order from Ancestor Publishers at the above address.

Edwin R. Purple was a charter member of the New York Genealogical & Biographical Society in 1869. His writing first appeared in 1876 as installments in the *RECORD*, and was finally published privately in this little book after his death. Much of the material came from unpublished records of the Reformed Dutch Church. It covers three or four generations of 21 early Dutch families, and gives the lineages in great detail. An index has been added for easy reference.



INTERNATIONAL PAF USERS' GROUP NEWSLETTER. Edited by Vance Parker. Published quarterly. Fiche 1 = 1989; fiche 2 = 1990; fiche 3 = 1991. \$3.00 per fiche postpaid. Order from Ancestor Publishers at the above address.

The most widely used genealogy software program today is Personal Ancestral File (PAF) which was developed by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Now there is a periodical published quarterly that gives interesting, informative and useful information concerning PAF. It has articles such as "Techniques for Hard Disk Users" and "Instructions for Increasing the Left Margin of PAF Reports". Regular features include "Questions from the Readers" and "Tips from Members." If you are using PAF, you may find the last three years of this periodical helpful.
