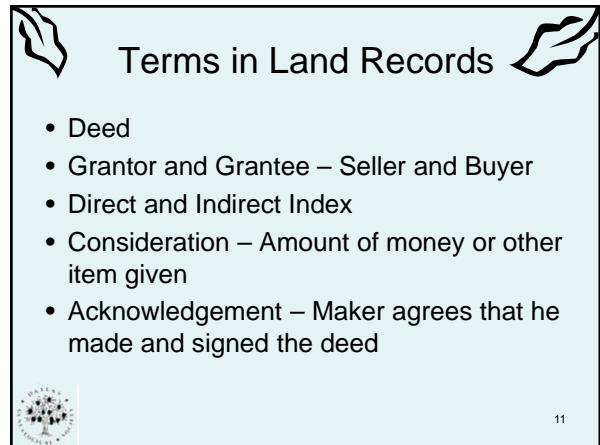
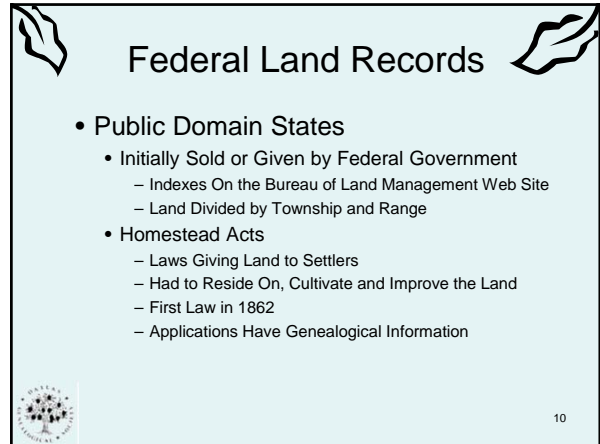

## State Land Terms


- Metes and Bounds – Describes land by measures and boundaries
- Calls – Descriptions of the boundaries
- Plat – Drawing and text showing the boundaries of piece of property
- Survey – Process of measuring the property
- Meanders – Turns of waterways

## Individual Land Sales


- Sales After the Initial Government Sale
- Recorded On Local Level
- Dower Rights in Some Jurisdictions
  - Wives had lifetime right to real property
  - She had to release those rights at time property was sold
  - Gives you her first name

## Terms in Federal Land


- Baseline and Principal Meridian – Point from which land is centered
  - Baseline = East-West line
  - Meridian = North-South line
- Township and Range – Six square miles of land divided into sections
- Aliquot parts – Exact subdivision of a section

## Deeds


- Transfers property from one owner to another
- Read several deeds in county to determine the “boilerplate” language
- Transcribe the deeds – forces you to read them completely
- Read and record the acknowledgement and dower release

## Federal Courts 1911-1952

- Supreme Court
  - Special Federal Courts – Court of Claims, Courts Martial, Indian Claims Commission
- Court of Appeals
  - United States Regulatory Commissions
- District Courts

## Probate Courts

- Will and Probate
  - Testate – has a will
    - Attested - in writing and witnessed
    - Holographic - handwritten by testator and not witnessed
    - Nuncupative – oral, deathbed before witnesses who record it and take it to court quickly
    - Administered by an executor
    - Will can be contested

## Probate Records

- Intestate – no will
  - Estate divided according to law
  - Administered by an administrator
  - Search for all heirs – find out names of other siblings

- State Supreme Court
- Intermediary Court of Appeals
- Superior Courts
- Inferior Courts

## Guardianship


- Responsible person of legal age appointed to handle affairs of underage or incompetents
- Also called a conservator, curator, tutor or receiver
- Sometimes a parent can be appointed guardian for his or her child

### Military Records

- World War I to Present
  - Many Army records destroyed in fire in 1973
  - Draft registrations survived
  - Within past 75 years only available to veteran and next of kin

- Court Minutes
- Juror Lists
- Road Crew Lists
- Voting Lists
- Petitions

### WWII Records

- “Old Man” World War II Draft Registrations
  - Conducted 27 April 1942
  - Born between 28 April 1877 – 16 February 1897
- Holocaust Collection at National Archives
- Records being digitized on fold3.com - subscription required
- 75 year privacy restrictions apply





### Military Records


- World War I Draft Registrations
  - Three registrations
    - 5 June 1917 – Born between 1886 – 1896
    - 5 June 1918 - Born between 1896 – 1897
    - 12 Sept 1918 – Extended down to age 18 and up to 45
      - » 13 Sept 1872 to 12 Sept 1900
  - Located on Ancestry (\$) and FamilySearch (Free)


### Pre WWI - Military Records

- Types
  - Military service records
  - Pensions claims records
  - Bounty land warrant applications (for service in Mexican War and earlier)
- Finding Aid for Regular Army
  - Microfilm: *Register of Enlistments in the U.S. Army, 1794-1911* by NARA

### Spanish American War

- Volunteers
- Most from Illinois, New York, Ohio and Pennsylvania
- 16,000 served
- Rough Riders from around country - 1,235 served
- Records on microfilm with NARA

### Military Records


- Pre-World War I Records
  - Located in National Archives and Records Administration
  - Microfilmed by Family History Library
  - Digital Records at fold3.com
  - Digital Records and Indexes at Ancestry

### Military Records

- Civil War
  - Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System (Online)
    - Identifies whether Union or Confederate
    - Identifies Regiment and Rank

## Military Records

Confederate

- Compiled Service Records
- Pensions – In state they were living at time of application, not where they served
- States have pension records

## Research Methods

- Identify the immigrant clearly
- Learn the historical background
- Search American records thoroughly first
- Learn the immigration process
  - Ellis Island did not change immigrants' names

  - Draft Records
  - Exemption Lists in newspapers of area
  - Pensions

## Naturalization

- After 1906 – Federal Court
- Before 1906 – Any Court
- 3 Step Process
  - Declaration of Intent
  - Petition (2<sup>nd</sup> or Final Papers)
  - Certificate of Naturalization


Prior to 1922 women took the citizenship of their husbands. No naturalizations.
