



DGS Surname Registry

One of the newest features available on the DGS web site is a Surname Registry. This tool allows DGS members to identify the family names (and some additional information) about the families that they are researching. Anybody who visits the site can search for names they are interested in. If they discover that they are researching the same family, the software allows them to contact the DGS member without ever revealing the members email address.

For example, anybody interested in the Amborn family would find this information in the Registry

Contact Name: Tony Hanson

Other Information: Emmigrated from Sachsen (near Wurtzburg) Germany in 1847. Settled in Lyons, Walworth County, Wisconsin

You must be a member of the DGS to enter names into the registry. However, the registry can be searched by any visitor to the DGS web site.
