1940 U. S. Federal Census

If you have any New York ancestors, this might help you:

Direct Me NYC 1940

One of the keys to finding your family in the 1940 census, until the indexes are published, is to find their address. The New York Public Library has created a web site to assist you in that effort. The Direct Me NYC 1940 site provides a browsable look at the 1940 telephone directories for each borough of New York City. Once you find the address, use other tools, such as Steve Morse's Unified 1940 ED Finder to locate the Enumeration District..
