Bockstruck Book Collection Donated to the DGS

The family of Lloyd D. Bockstruck generously donated his personal library of more than 400 genealogy and historical books to the Dallas Genealogical Society. DGS will offer the collection to the Genealogy Section of the Dallas Public Library.

On June 7, DGS members Tony Hanson, Barbara Ware, Patrick McKinney and Suzan Younger collected twenty-one boxes of books and transported them to the Dallas Public Library. The



Genealogy Section is providing temporary storage space on the 8th floor of the Dallas Public Library. Patrick McKinney, Barbara Ware and Suzan Younger are in the process of inventorying the collection and checking the Dallas Public Library catalog for call numbers of books already owned by the library. The inventory will identify books as "owned" or "not owned" by the library, giving the library the option to replace worn books with duplicates from the Bockstruck library.

The DGS board will decide how to dispose of books not accepted by the Dallas Public Library, with priority given to genealogy sections in other North Texas libraries. If you have ideas or suggestions please contact Suzan (at technologysig@dallasgenealogy.org) or any board member.

Be a Witness to the Longest History Lesson!

On August 24, 2018 Andrew Torget, Ph.D., Associate Professor of History at the University of North Texas, along with a class of students, will attempt to set a world record for the longest continual history class and have it recorded by the Guinness



Book of World Records (GBWR). Dr. Torget will teach his semester-long Texas history course in a single, 24-hour marathon session.

The entire attempt will be live streamed on the Portal to Texas History website. In concert with this, the Portal will be doing fundraising for the *Cathy Nelson Hartman Portal to Texas History Endowment*, a fund DGS and our members have generously supported.

To verify that the record is set within the conditions outlined by GBWR, the UNT Libraries are seeking volunteers to witness the attempt. Witnesses will be asked to show up an hour before their 4-hour shift, so the total commitment will be 5 hours.

Witnesses will have to make log book entries based on their observations during their shift and provide their contact information. Guinness may follow up with witnesses to ensure they are independent as they verify evidence.

Irish Genealogical Research: Finding Your Ancestors on the Emerald Isle

David E. Rencher, AG, CG, FUGA, FIGRS, is employed as the Chief Genealogical Officer for FamilySearch. A professional genealogist since 1977, he is one of the rare few who have earned both credentials: Accredited Genealogist with ICAPGen in Ireland research and Certified Genealogist® with the Board for Certification of Genealogists®.

Since 1997, he serves as the Irish course coordinator and instructor for the Institute of Genealogical and Historical Research (IGHR). He is a past-president of the Federation of Genealogical Societies and the Utah Genealogical Association. He currently serves on the Board of the Federation of Genealogical Societies.

David is a Fellow of the Utah Genealogical Association and the Irish Genealogical Research Society, London, and is currently an instructor for the British Institute where he also serves as a Trustee of the International Society for British Genealogy and Family History.
