Genealogy researchers – the Dallas Public Library staff has missed you SO much! After being closed for over a year, we are excited to announce we are planning for a limited reopening on May 4. For our fabulous researchers, the <u>genealogy collection</u> and <u>Heritage Lab</u> will be available by appointment only. Contact us by email <u>genealogy@dallaslibrary.org</u> or



phone (214) 670-1433, to arrange an appointment. Appointments will be 2-3 hours in length, during our new opening hours – Tuesday, Thursday-Saturday 10-6, and Wednesday 11-7.

Please know that staff is taking the utmost care in making your return to the library a safe one. Staff and visitors will be required to wear a mask and stay 6 feet apart unless you are from the same household. Sanitizing stations will be available when you enter the building and restrooms have been fitted with touchless equipment. We are also thrilled to report that we have brand new elevators!

The *History of Texas World War Heroes* by John McCrae, published by the Army & Navy History Company in 1919, is one of those unexpected gems that can provide a researcher with an answer long sought after. The book contains hundreds of names, and not just as lists. There is biographical information for the military personnel that may include any or all of the



following: name/rank; parent's name and address, spouse, or other family members; birthdate/birthplace; education; enlistment date; military unit in which he/she served; training location; departure date/location for overseas service; promotions; date of discharge or death; cause of death if applicable; AND a picture.
