February Survey Results: How Your Parents Met

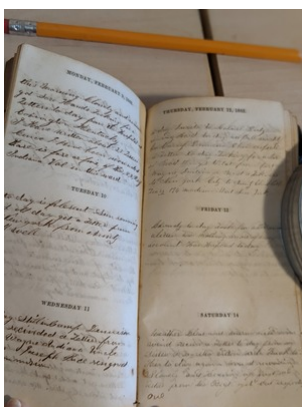
Last month's survey asked about how reader's parents met.
