Letter from the DGS President, Tony Hanson



DGS Board Members and a few others participated in a SWOT (Strength, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) analysis earlier this summer.

The results were illuminating:

- Our relationship with the Dallas Public Library, our hybrid meeting abilities, our Newsletter, and our website were identified as our top strengths.
- We need to focus on leadership development, succession planning and engagement with the broader Dallas genealogical community.
- We face challenges from the availability of online resources, declining interest in joining societies and the increasing age of our members.
- There are many exciting opportunities for us to pursue, especially in the area of expanding and improving our relationship with other historical and genealogical organizations in the Dallas area.

The information from the analysis helped focus discussions at our August 5th planning conference. We identified and prioritized many projects and process improvements which will be implemented in the coming months. Stay tuned!
