



Do You Have DNA Kits with MyHeritage or 23andMe?



If you uploaded your DNA to MyHeritage, or bought a DNA kit from either MyHeritage or 23andMe, you probably noticed some changes in the past few months where some features were not available to you. This was a direct result of issues related to an earlier problem where consumers re-

used the same passwords on multiple sites, leading to a breach.

But now, more of those features have returned! Take advantage of this change right away, if you can. You may want to download a copy of your raw DNA for your own storage and future use; or you may want to take screenshots of your matches' data in case there are any other future issues that would restrict access again. MyHeritage is also allowing you to add another researcher to work on your DNA for the first time. It comes with a lot of access to your information, so review that carefully before taking any action.

Dallas Residents, What Do You Know About Proposition D?

The city of Dallas has proposed a bond package that includes funding for the Dallas Public Library system. If approved, Proposition D (one of 10 individual propositions)

would provide \$43,530,000 in funding for library facilities.
