

From the President's Desk - DGS Needs You!

The advent of virtual meetings has had a huge impact on all genealogy societies. Many societies only exist today because they adapted virtual meeting technology during the COVID pandemic. And in many ways, it has allowed societies to reach a greater number of people. Take our own society as an example:

- In 2018, our General Meetings attracted a total of 272 in-person participants.
- In 2023 our General Meetings attracted a total of 190 in-person participants. However, we had an additional 1,435 participants who attended via Zoom or watched recordings of the meetings.

While we are delighted to see our reach expand from 272 to 1,625 participants (math geeks will note that that is nearly a 500% increase!), we have not seen a corresponding increase in participation in our society leadership positions, and the organization has been finding it difficult to fill key board positions. This is the primary motivation for the bylaw changes that are being proposed by the board of directors.

We are in the process of creating a Skills & Leadership Interest survey that we can use to identify and engage those of you with the skills and interest that are needed for us to continue to thrive as an organization.

The good news about this new virtual reality is that you can participate in the operations and leadership of the society regardless of where you live. Please give strong consideration to "giving back" by becoming involved.

DGS Proposed By-Law Changes

The DGS Board of Directors recommends making several changes to our current bylaws:

- Elimination of term limits for the President.
- Elimination of the requirement of prior board service for the president.
- Clarification of circumstances for the end of a term in office.

The changes will be discussed during the General Meeting. The proposed changes will take effect immediately if approved.

Monthly DNA Tip - Making the most of your shared matches

Ancestry recently introduced ProTools, which allows users to compare the shared matches that they have in common with their original match list for the first time.

While other providers such as MyHeritage and FamilyTree DNA previously allowed this option, Ancestry had not. Due to the size of Ancestry's database, this can be a game-changer for solving brick walls.



A very simple example: When you have a DNA match who has no tree and a surname that you do not recognize, it can be challenging to figure out the connection. With shared matches, you might see that this person had a shared match with a known cousin of yours, at the second cousin level. Now you know exactly where to start your research for how this person might fit in your tree.

With that additional information, you can check your shared matches at the other sites, and may be able to make new discoveries there, too!
