## Session 1 ~ Introduction to Irish Internet Sites

## Session 3 ~ Chasing the Poor and the Landless

Defining the landless through alternate record sources is crucial for identifying the poorest of the poor. The records of the Irish poor are voluminous, but are scattered throughout the country. This session helps you understand where and how to approach this particular type of problem.

**Records** Prior to parish registers, estate, land, and property records are the next best records to identify generational links and family information for land owners and tenants. This session gives you the tools necessary to examine these invaluable records.

A professional genealogist since 1977, he is one of the rare few who have earned both credentials: Accredited Genealogist<sup>CM</sup> with ICAPGen<sup>SM</sup> in Ireland research, and Certified Genealogist<sup>R</sup> with the Board for Certification of Genealogists<sup>R</sup>. He is the Irish course coordinator and instructor for the *Institute of Genealogical and Historical Research (IGHR)* in Athens, Georgia.

David graduated from Brigham Young University in 1980 with a BA in Family and Local History. He is a past-president of the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS) 1997-2000, a past-president of the Utah Genealogical Association (UGA) 1993-1995, and a Fellow of that organization.

David is a fellow of the Irish Genealogical Research Society, London and is a vice-president of the Genealogical Society of Utah (GSU). He is the past Chair of the joint Federation of Genealogical Societies, National Genealogical Society and International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies committee for Record Preservation and Access; serves on the board of the Federation of Genealogical Societies, and as a trustee for the Umpstead, Jr. and Elizabeth Jemima Philpott Rencher and the Winslow Farr, Sr. Family Organizations. He is a Trustee of the International Society for British Genealogy and Family History, and an instructor for the British Institute.
